a sharp eye for detail and a methodical approach – qualities which match the abilities of people with autism.

Ms Susan Hwee, Head of Group Technology and Operations, UOB Group, said the Bank is honoured to be

recognised for its efforts to champion inclusive business in Singapore.

"We began our inclusive journey at the UOB Scan Hub with the vision to create meaningful and long-term job opportunities for our employees by understanding and focusing on their different abilities. It is heartening to see that this journey has touched the lives of many of our employees and their families. At the same time, the Bank has also benefitted from having a stable and reliable team of employees who are committed and enthusiastic about

their work because the tasks draw on the strengths that they have," said Ms Hwee.

Training and career opportunities at UOB Scan Hub for people with special needs

UOB partnered with the Autism Resource Centre's (ARC) Employability and Employment Centre to establish a structured employment process including selection, onboarding, training and counseling to help its new employees

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with autism succeed. Besides redesigning work processes under the guidance of ARC, the Bank assigned work buddies to each employee to help them adjust to the working environment. In addition, ARC placed job coaches onsite to guide their work and to train supervisors on how to manage employees with autism.

Since redesigning the roles and hiring the team at UOB Scan Hub, employee turnover has decreased and overall work productivity has increased. UOB will continue to invest in training and developing career progression plans to help employees with special needs take on more responsibilities at the Scan Hub.

Mr Tay Wei Qun, an employee with autism who works as a clerical assistant at the UOB Scan Hub, looks forward to expanding his job scope and career opportunities with the Bank. He has been working at UOB Scan Hub for a year. "I like everything at UOB Scan Hub and I can learn many new things," said Mr Tay.
